Types of Books used to Teach Kids to Read

Authentic Text



Information or Enjoyment

Written for information or enjoyment in natural language.

Authentic text is not meant as a teaching tool.

Predictable, Repetitive Text

Memorization

The style of writing meant to teach children to read using a combination of high frequency (sight) words repeated throughout the book and pictures for children to guess words that are more difficult. These types of books encourage memorizations as a strategy as opposed to decoding words.

Leveled Books

High Frequency Words

Books are organized according to a gradient system from A-Z utilizing predictable, repetitive text in the beginning and using a controlled set of high frequency words that will increase in difficulty, while sentences increase in length. They are not controlled by letter and sound correspondences in words.

Decodable Books

Sound Aloud

Sequential and cumulative based on letter and sound correspondences in words. Word choice is controlled by phonics principles rather than high frequency words to memorize. Decodables are meant to be a teaching tool for practice. Once decoding is automatic, children are able to transition to authentic literature.
